"Es hat mich niemand gelehrt, Pandanus für meine Tiere zu benutzen. Ich habe es mir selbst beigebracht und entwickle immer neue Schaffensweisen. Das sind alles meine eigenen Ideen... Ich gebe meine Ideen an meine Kinder und Enkel weiter. Es ist wichtig, dass ich sie alles lehre, denn eines Tages werde ich gegangen sein und sie werden meinen Platz einnehmen." (Lena Yarinkura, 2012)

Lena Yarinkura ist berühmt für ihre ambitionierten und unverwechselbaren Skulpturen aus Pandanus- und Paperbarkfasern. Lena wich von den konventionellen Flechtarbeiten ihrer Zeitgenossen ab und war eine der ersten Frauen im Arnhemland, die mit Fasern auch skulptural gearbeitet haben.

Lenas Methode mit den Pandanusfasern umzugehen, hat sie nach dem gleichen Prozess entwickelt, wie auch dilly bags [traditionelle Tragetaschen] und Fischreusen hergestellt werden: zuerst wird ein geschlossenes Ende hergestellt, wie zum Beispiel beim Boden einer dilly bag.

Wenn Lena ihre bekannten Yawkyawk-Geistwesen fertigt, arbeitet sie als erstes aus dem bereits geflochtenen Material vorsichtig eine runde Körperform heraus. Am unteren Teil des Körpers oder auf Hüfthöhe wird der Körper verengt, um daran zwei flach gearbeitete Schwanzflossen anzuschließen. Die auf die Pandanus-Fasern aufgetragenen Ockerfarben vermitteln einen Eindruck der Vielfältigkeit der Wassergeistwesen und geben das Schimmern ihrer Haut wieder.

Lena Yarinkura "vereint Divergenz und Erfindungskraft und lässt Intuition und Spontaneität in ihrem Schaffensprozess zu".
