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Marrnyulas Vater ist der bereits verstorbene Djutjadjutja. Sie lebt in Yirrkala und arbeitet bei Buku-Larrngay Mulka als erfahrene Radiererin im Druckstudio. Sie begann dort in den 1980er Jahren zu arbeiten, als Steve Fox Kunstkoordinator war. Neben ihrer Arbeit als Kunstschauffende wurde sie in dieser Zeit in einem der künstlerisch produktivsten Camps in Yirrkala ausgebildet. Sowohl ihre Mutter Nonggirrja als auch ihr Vater Djutjadjutja (1935 – 1999) stellten unter Mithilfe ihrer Söhne und Töchter ununterbrochen Kunstwerke her. Marrnyula half ihrem Vater (dem Preisträger des „Best Bark Award“ beim National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art Award 1997) bei seinen heiligen Djapu-Gemälden, entwickelte aber auch ihren eigenen Erzählstil in naiver Malerei. Gleichzeitig unterstützt sie ihre große Familie materiell und moralisch und ist wie eine Mutter für die drei Kinder ihres Bruders.

Im Jahre 2007 stellte Marrnyula zusammen mit ihrer Mutter Nonggirrja Mararwili einige Werke in den Annandale Galleries aus, wo sie das Design des Djapu-Clans malten. Im Jahre 2009 war sie Teil von „Making it New“, einer umfangreichen Studie zu moderner Kunst am Museum of Contemporary Art in Sydney.

Marrnyula nahm mit John Wolseley und Fiona Hall am Djalkiri-Projekt teil, das immer noch durch Australien tourt. Im Jahre 2013 stellte sie in der Seva Frangos Gallery in Perth und im Folgejahr bei Marshall Arts in Adelaide aus.

Anfang 2015 erregte Marrnyula bei Gertrude Contemporary mit einer bahnbrechenden Installation von 252 Arbeiten auf Rinde viel Aufmerksamkeit
