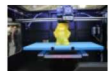

# DREAMING IN THE AUSTRALIAN OUTBACK



Next weekend the Outback is coming to Freiburg, Germany. Artkelch gallery, specialized in Aboriginal art, is hosting an exhibit 'Outside Fog - Inside a Storm of Colors'. Jukurrpa ('dreaming' when directly translated) is a common thread throughout the exhibit. Jukurrpa is the period in which ancestral beings roamed the deserts and performed creative acts that bring meaning to the world. Bright colors are characteristic for the works, although originally the colors were more earth tones before acrylic paints started to be used.

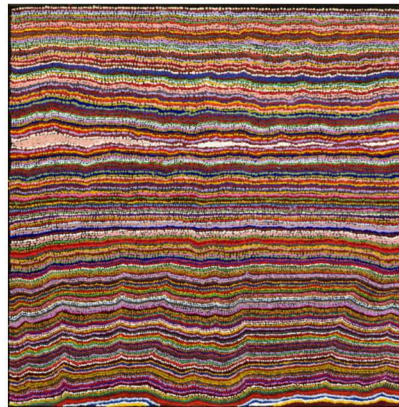
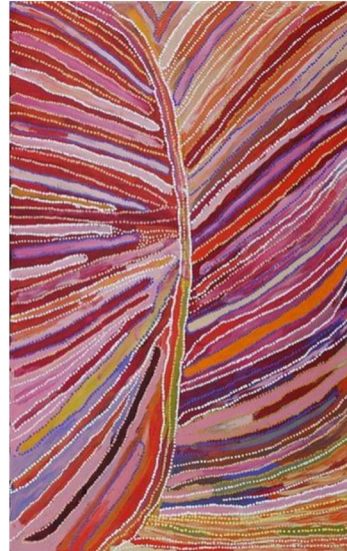
