Judy Napangardi wurde in Yarungkanji, Mt. Doreen Station, zu einer Zeit geboren, als viele Warlpiri und andere Menschen der Central and Western Desert ein traditionelles Nomadenleben führten.

Judy unternahm mit ihrer Familie zu Fuß viele Reisen in ihr Land und lebte längere Zeit in Mina Mina und Yingipurlangu, dem Land ihrer Vorfahren am Rande der Tanami und der Gibson Wüste. Diese Gegenden sind reich an Buschnahrung wie Buschpflaumen (wanakiji), Buschtomaten (yakajirri) und Sandwarane (wardapi), einer Echsenart.

Judy ging häufig in der Nähe ihres Landes, westlich von Yuendumu, auf die Jagd. Trotz ihrer sehr zierlichen Figur war sie Mutter von zehn Kindern, von denen vier bereits gestorben sind.

Judy lernte das Malen von ihrer älteren Schwester Maggie Napangardi Watson. Sie malte in Yuendumu jahrelang an deren Seite und entwickelte dabei ihren eigenen, einzigartigen Stil. Sie war eine Frau mit einer unglaublichen Energie. Dies zeigt sich in ihren Werken durch den dynamischen Gebrauch von Farbe und der Entwicklung eines speziellen Malstils: Sie erreicht kontrastierende Farblinien mit reich strukturierter Oberfläche, indem sie die aufgetragenen Punkte lang zieht („dragged dotting“ style).

Judy befand sich an der Schwelle zu einer abstrakteren Wiedergabe der Jukurrpa (Schöpfungsgeschichte), trotzdem behielt sie in ihren Gemälden die strenge Ikonographie ihrer Dreamings (kurruwarri) bei, die von der Heiligkeit der Stätten sowie der Lieder ihrer Kultur berichten.

Judy gehört zu den berühmtesten Künstlern aus Yuendumu. Ihre Gemälde sind in wichtigen privaten und öffentlichen Sammlungen zu finden, unter anderem auch in der Nationalgalerie Australiens.
