Ngipi Ward lebt in der kleinen und sehr entlegenen Gemeinde Patjarr, auch Karilywarra genannt, in der Gibson Desert in Western Australia. Sie wurde in der Nähe von Yunpalara (Lake Blair) bei Yirril – was Stock ansitzen bedeutet – geboren, wo sie mit ihrer Familie bis in die 1960er Jahre ein Leben als Jäger und Sammler führte. Ihr Lebensstil wurde in dem Dokumentarfilm des Anthropologen Ian Dunlop „People of the Australian Western Desert“, dargestellt, der von der Australian Commonwealth Film Unit produziert wurde. Ngipi Ward ist eine erfahrene Jägerin und eine Künstlerin von zunehmendem Bekanntheitsgrad.
